

## **2022 -2023 Middle School and Jr. High Quiz Bowl**

*Please note: At this time, we are planning to have our Middle School and Jr. High Quiz Bowl tournaments in person at the ESC. We will, however, be limiting the number of students to 8 per team (plus 1 coach at the moderator's table per team). **Determinations about allowing audience members will be made at a later date and you will be informed.** In the event of the Covid-19 situation changing significantly, the tournament may have to be canceled for the safety of all involved. Sharee will keep you updated as the date of the tournament approaches.*

The following policies will be in place for this year's Quiz Bowl Tournaments. **Please be sure to read this carefully:**

### **Middle School (Grades 5 & 6) and Jr. High (Grades 7 & 8) – 2022-23**

We will follow Ohio Academic Competition Rules (posted on our website) with the following exceptions:

- In reference to OAC Rule C2: **The ESC will have two separate competitions locally – one for Middle School (grades 5 & 6) and one for Jr. High (grades 7 & 8).** Coaches may arrange their own scrimmages prior to the tournament.
- In reference to OAC Rule C5: **Teams are expected to be here at the scheduled start time for their match and it will be considered a forfeiture if the team is more than 10 minutes late.** This rule is in place to allow the tournament to continue for the other teams. In the event of a team forfeiting, the opposing team will receive 32 points for Middle School and 44 points for Jr. High for that round (these are based on the average score of winning teams in 2021 (which was our last tournament).
- In reference to OAC Rule C7: Paper (and/or white boards) will be provided. **Students are NOT to have their own papers or notebooks at the table when competing.**
- In reference to OAC Rule D8: It will not be possible to have a Protest Committee, in which case the Moderator and/or the Tournament Director will be the final authority.
- In reference to OAC Rules D9: **Any challenged answer must be presented to the moderator by the coach immediately (before the match has ended), but the challenge will not be entertained until the end of the match.** After the moderator or Tournament Director has studied the challenge, a final determination will be made **and that decision will be final. If the challenge does not affect the outcome of the match, the challenge will NOT be entertained.**
- In reference to OAC Rule D11: **Team coaches (1 per team) are expected to sit at the front table (opposite where their team sits) with the moderator to run the timer and keep score.**
- In reference to OAC Rule E2: Audio and videotaping is prohibited **and all cell phones should be turned off during competitions (including players, audience members and coaches).**
- Just a reminder...In reference to OAC Rule F2: In the event of a tie, three additional questions will be asked to break the tie. If after those three tiebreaker questions, the game is still tied, the tie will be broken by reading one final round question at a time in a sudden death fashion.
- In reference to OAC Rule J4: The **coaches** will check the opposite team's Alphabet answers as the moderator reads the answers.

## **General Information**

Each team will be playing at least two matches. There will be two competitions going on at the same time (in two separate rooms), which makes it very important for everyone to stay on schedule. Teams not playing during any given competition are asked to wait **very quietly in the gym**. Teams may or may not be able to watch other teams compete...this will be determined the week prior to the tournament. If your team is permitted to observe other teams competing, please remember NOT to enter competition rooms for any reason AFTER a competition has begun or leave before a competition has ended.

Coaches are to **stay with their students at all times** and be aware that they should only be in designated parts of the building (the gym, hallways, or competition rooms).

There are built-in Make-Up Days for both the Middle School and Jr. High Tournament. In general, this will only be used in event of weather emergencies. The Tournament Director will email coaches as soon as changes are made and it will be posted on the ESC website [www.scoesc.org](http://www.scoesc.org) .

Middle School and Jr. High teams are responsible for scheduling their own scrimmages with other schools. The ESC will email teams with the tournament schedule a few weeks prior to the tournament.

The **Middle School Tournament will be held on Wednesday, October 19, and the first match will begin at 4:00 p.m.** The **Jr. High Tournament will be held on Wednesday, November 2, with the first match beginning at 4:00 p.m.** Teams will need to see the schedule to know what time they should arrive, but be sure to be here **at least 10 minutes prior to the start of their first match.**

Each participating team will play at least two matches. The Championship Round will be determined by, first, looking at records (to see which teams have won both matches). Then, if more than two teams have gone 2 and 0, the points will be totaled for those teams. The two teams that have won twice and that have the highest total scores will play the Championship Round. In the event that only one team has won twice, that team will be in the Championship Round playing against the team that had the highest score otherwise.
